Join FoNS Trustee Dr Marion Lynch and Lived Experience Lead Jolie Goodman for the third Art of Nursing webinar to hear how artists are helping health.

Marion says: *The art of nursing is “the intentional, creative use of oneself, based on skill and expertise, to transmit emotion and meaning” (Jenner 1997). Without our emotions and meaning making we, as people, could be*

judged as just meat. A disturbing word and image conjuring up a disturbing way of seeing who we are. This is the power of language, art, and art pedagogy.

Our Art of Nursing Real Partnership Webinar on 22 January 2025 does just this. The hour-long webinar, 13.00-14.00 GMT is led by experts by experience and artist educators, It provides an inspiring hour to deepen understanding, compassion and competence through visual art. The webinar will enable participants to also appreciate the idea of sympathetic presence as part of person-centred care and make this 'something else' seen and felt. Visceral.
